

Photography 7 - The grade 7s have been exploring different techniques and skills in photography class. There is a lot of creativity in this group. A common theme in their daily uploads is photos of cats!

<u>Bio 20</u>

As grades 7-12 students shifted to online, students learned the true value of being resourceful. Instead of looking at a real heart, the Biology 20 class had an opportunity to use both sides of their brain to



"create a model of the heart." They had to tap into their right creative side and their logical side to ensure they had all the connections

right. They not only had to show the four chambers of the heart, but also all of the





blood vessels that attach to it. They also had to explain how blood goes from one section to the next and if it is oxygenated at that point or not. Here are some of the amazingly creative assignments they were able to create with whatever they could find in their new classrooms.

The Causes of WWI

The Social 20 class completed an assignment where they had to create a political cartoon and provide an editorial on the causes of World War One. Here is one of the pieces.



Within this cartoon you can see a Russian man throwing darts at a dart board, with news that Austria/Hungary is having issues with Serbia. The dart board labelling bullseye as minding your own business and not being involved in other countries politics, while the rest of the board says get involved and potentially start a world war. The Russian man is most likely not to hit the centre of the board, as you can see his previous two shots missed the board and he is blindfolded. I think that in 1914 the Russians were the ones that truly started the war, they bothered an ordinary war between two nations and got involved; which got other countries involved as well. This cartoon is a comical idea of the options that Russian politicians had before making the decision of getting involved in the war.
