- Bring something to do especially for the long shifts


- To sign up, simply write your name & the name of the person you're travelling/staying with.

The last day of classes for grade 10-12 students is on January 21st. Teachers expect all students to attend regular classes as important review and preparations for exams takes place during this time.

Provincial Diploma Exams follow strict rules set by Alberta Education. The dates and times must be adhered to. All exams across the province begin at the same time, exams are secured until the exam begins, and students must remain in the exam for a minimum of one hour. Exams have been written to be completed in three hours; however, students are allowed up to six hours to write the exam. If a student is late for an exam, they can only enter the exam if they arrive prior to the one hour mark. After 10:00 am, they are not allowed to begin the exam as the exam is no longer secured. Please assist us in ensuring your child is at school on time and prepared to write the exam. We do call home if students are not present.

School based exams have a little more flexibility, but the dates have been set and students have been informed about the schedule prior to Christmas holidays. Students are expected to be at school by 8:45am and they will have three hours to write the exam. Once the exam is over, students are allowed to leave the school. Signing out is still required and parents need to inform the school that their child has left the school - it's a safety thing.

Happy studying and good luck on your exams! Semester 2 begins on January 31st.

Please note: If students do not have exams scheduled, they do not need to attend school after JANUARY 21ST unless they have an exam to write. If students do come to school, they are here to work/study and are not allowed to leave to go visit friends in town.
