A modern rendition of a Metis trappers tent has been temporarily constructed and is being used to explore Metis and local peoples that have helped shape our community, province and country. Students have had the opportunity to listen to traditional stories from elders and staff, which has provided an exciting opportunity to bring history to life. Through oral accounts, students have made many connections to their own experiences and are thrilled to share their stories. Many of the living artifacts and furs in the tent have been lent to our grade 4 class from the Buffalo Lake Metis Settlement and local Plamondon trappers.

"The Métis are a distinct cultural group within Canada's indigenous people, tracing their roots to European explorers and fur traders (mostly men) who started families with indigenous people (mostly women) while working for trading companies such as the Hudson's Bay Company."



Jump Rope for Heart


