#### **Student Illness Guidelines**

There have been changes to the daily symptom checklist by Alberta's Chief Medical Officer of Health. The new COVID-19 Alberta Health Daily Checklist (For Children Under 18) comes into effect starting Monday, November 2. Please ensure you are completing the checklist with all of your children prior to sending them to school. The new checklist applies to students ONLY. The symptoms and requirements for adults have not changed and are different from the ones for children. Adults should refer to the

Symptoms and testing page of Alberta's COVID-19 website for guidelines.

The biggest change is that runny nose and sore throat have been removed from the mandatory isolation checklist. According to the Chief Medical Officer "This means that any child who only has one of these symptoms will no longer be recommended for COVID-19 testing and does not need to be kept home for 10 days. Instead, they should stay home for 24 hours and monitor their condition. If they are feeling better after 24 hours, they may return to school and/or activities. If they are feeling worse, or if additional symptoms appear, they should be tested for COVID-19 and stay home until all symptoms are resolved."

Thank you for continuing to follow these guidelines.

#### **High School Exam Schedule**

In the first week of November, High School Students are completing their first quarter and writing finals on November 5th and 6th. Quarter 2 begins on November 9th. A final exam schedule is attached at the end of the newsletter, on our Facebook page and website. Please note: Thursday and Friday are exam days. Regular class schedule is not in effect. Exams are written in the morning. Students may choose to stay at school for the remainder of the day; however, they need to remain in the assigned classroom with their cohort. Students leaving the building for the day need to sign out, and provide a note from their parent that states the parent is aware the student is going home and with whom the student is travelling.

#### Grade 5



#### **Grade 5 Science**




Grade 5 Science Students have been working hard to build electric series circuits and parallel circuits, and to use symbols in their schematics to represent what they are constructing.




#### **Grade 6 Social Studies**
