
A good rule to follow is when children have been symptom free for 24 hours, then returning to school is possible. Thank you for helping us stay healthy until the end of the year.

In the past three weeks we have been experimenting with simple machines by building contraptions that include pulleys, wedges, screws, inclined planes, levers and wheel and axles. Mr Ennest in the shop has so kindly allowed us to practice what we have learned by allowing us to visit the EPS shop and participate in hands-on activities.

Ask your child about budgeting and grocery shopping. We have been working on applying our knowledge of decimals and money to real life situations by using the prices of products found in paper flyers and by creating our own mini stores. This has been a real hit in our class.

Just before Spring Break, we will be completing our short stories and creating Hay Clay characters to star in our stop motion films. Students are pretty excited for this.
