Kindergarten

In Kindergarten we have been so lucky to have Glenda Bouvier who is a practicum teacher. She brings in new ideas and lots of new centers for the students to investigate. This week she brought nature to us with some special math and art centers using sticks. We also have a special thank you to Feather and Twigs Hobby Farm for bringing an incubator and eggs to our classroom. The kids are patiently waiting and watching the eggs daily - so far we are 5 days in - only 16 more to go. In Language Arts we have been focusing on Lowercase alphabet recognition and correlating initial sounds. The students are getting really good at hearing the sounds and finding correlating items that go with them. We are about to put out some new centers in Math where the students will investigate 3-D Shapes, Shape and Space transformations, Measurement, and Weight. In Health we were fortunate to have Colgate send us some new toothbrushes and toothpaste, along with some video tips and stories to help

us learn how to brush and floss our teeth appropriately.













Grade 1

In Grade one Mathematics we have been learning about the different coins in Canadian currency and doubling numbers! One of our favorite weekly activities is our esti-mystery. The students have to make an estimated guess of how many items in a cup. Then we go through the clues to see which guess is the closest and which guesses are eliminated. In Science we are working on our Lifecycle unit so we have been watching the chicks in the Kindergarten room, and we planted Sunflowers to follow the plant life cycle and journal our scientific observations. We made some guesses about which grows faster in the life cycle - Chicks or Sunflowers. We should find out in the next couple of weeks. In Health we were fortunate to have Colgate send us some new toothbrushes and toothpaste, along with some video tips and stories to help us learn how to brush and floss our teeth appropriately.

Grade 2

The Grade Two class was busy during the month of May learning about new and interesting things! The children all researched

a type of bug and then presented their findings to the class. We also were able to watch our own classroom butterflies change from larva into adult butterflies. We are looking forward to building boats in our Boats and Buoyancy Science unit. In our Social Studies class, we finished our exploration of Saskatoon and Ukrainian culture, and we are looking forward to learning about our own community. In Math class, we learned how to measure the length, height, and mass of objects. We are looking forward to the new things we will be learning and the adventures we will be taking in June! Grade 2 students have raised and released 15 Monarch butterflies this month!

It is so exciting that we are already in our last month of the school year! I know the grade threes are really looking forward to their well-deserved summer vacation!




May was a blast! We had some great weather to enjoy and spent a lot of P.E. time outside. The grade threes really enjoyed their author visits with both David Poulsen and Gail de Vos! It was fun having virtual presentations by them and the students liked learning more about writing stories. This month we also had two additional in-person presentations, one from a

Peace Officer about Bike Safety and another from Mrs. Mahe about Hearing Safety. It was fun learning about these topics!

In June we have even more exciting events planned! There are various activities taking

place that the students will learn about soon and a year-end field trip! The grade threes have worked very hard all year and are continuing to do so in our last few weeks remaining. Here are a few pictures to highlight some of the learning we have done:



Mrs. Evdokimov and Lien's Grade 3 Class

In grade 3 Science we are learning about rocks and minerals. In the first two pictures students are trying to break open rocks so we can record the similarities and differences between the inside and outside. In the third picture students are spraying rocks with water so they are able to see how much more vibrant the colours are when the rocks are wet. In the girth picture the students are sorting rocks according to their colours, shapes, and texture. In the fifth picture each glass has something different in it. We

used vinegar which is an acid to each glass to observe which one will fizz. In the last picture we did sand art where the students drew a picture then they covered certain areas of their picture with sand.













Grade 4 News

One more month closer to summer break! This month in grade 4, we began successfully germinating beans and planting various other plants to accompany our Plant Growth unit in science. In social studies, we have studied Indigenous technology including methods used for hunting and gathering pre European contact. Students constructed sweet imitation buffalo pounds and jumps using marshmallows and spaghetti. Also, we are moving into learning about the last of the six regions, the Boreal Forest. If you have an extra shoebox laying around, please send it with your child as we will be creating dioramas as a final social studies project.

June 21 is National Indigenous People's Day. The grade fours will be taking a field trip to the Buffalo Lake Metis Settlement to enjoy a day full of Metis celebrations. Parent volunteers

Grade 5 News

Grade 5 Students built Solar Stills for distilling water from plants, and will continue to identify ways of using water and other household products to separate and combine substances.

Grade 5 went to swimming lessons in Lac La Biche this past month. They had a lot of fun and did very well learning how to swim in the deep end. Cole attended swimming as well and spent time with Ms. McCullough and his friends in the little pool and the big pool. Sadly for Ms. McCullough, Cole was not too interested in going in the hot tub!

A lot of the Grade 5s and Grade 6s went to Track and Field this month. It's been pretty busy and hard to get to practices, because a lot of people are also attending baseball. We are really happy with the nice spring weather for all these fun events.

Grade 6 News

Grade 6 students completed their Flight, Air and Aerodynamics unit with constructing parachutes, hot air balloons and airfoils to develop deeper connections between Bernoulli's Principle and the Properties of Air. Students Applied their knowledge of Air and the Particle Model of MAtter toward fire as an entrance into our final unit of study - Evidence and Investigation. Students are already identifying unique features of fingerprints, and identifying that similar patterns exist in shoeprints and tire tread prints from vehicles.


Learning Commons


